THIS SUNDAY'S READINGS

Acts 10.34-43

Peter, a Jew, visits the house of Cornelius, a Roman solider and therefore a Gentile. Normally Jews and Gentiles did not mix. Peter declares that in raising Jesus from the dead, God has removed the distinctions between Jews and Gentiles, since Jesus has shown to be 'Lord of all'.

1 Corinthians 15.34-43

Paul begins by reminding the Corinthian Christians that the resurrection is an integral part of the Gospel he had preached and they had received and believed. Some had argued that there was no resurrection of the dead. Paul calls for the Corinthians to stop sinning in denying the resurrection of the dead and, by implication, the resurrection of Christ – a denial that leads to loose living.

Luke 24.1-12

Jesus has predicted that he will be raised. The word translated "remember" means: 'bring to bear in the present, with power and deep insight, the meaning of past actions and words in God's plan of salvation.' Jesus used this word of the Last Supper. It is the women who first proclaim the Easter gospel, but to the apostles it is unbelievable. Peter goes to see for himself, but he still lacks the sight of faith.
